



1. An acrostic has been used to define grace: **G**od's **R**iches **A**t **C**hrist's **E**xpense. Do you think that adequately defines grace? Why or why not?
2. Read Ephesians 2:1-10. What does it mean to be "dead" in our sins? In what sense is a Christian "raised up" with Christ and what role does grace play in that?
3. Why do you suppose God chose grace instead of works? Why do you suppose so many people try to choose works instead of grace?
4. Describe what it means to live under grace and not under the law.
5. Read Romans 6:1-7. Explain the logic of the question found in verse 1. What part does "baptism" (vv. 3-4) play in the area of grace?

6. The Apostle Paul, in Philippians 2:12 says, "...work out your salvation with fear and trembling." How do we reconcile that with other passages (see Eph. 2:5) that tell us that we are saved by grace? In other words, what is there to "work out" if God's grace has saved us?

7. Is it possible to "fall from grace?" Give scripture to support your answer.

8. Why are we commanded to be "holy" or "perfect" if we are under God's grace?

9. Read Hebrews 10:29. Who or what is the "Spirit of Grace" spoken of and why do you think so?

10. John 1:17 says, "...grace and truth were realized through Jesus Christ." List several ways in which this is true.
